RESERVATIONS ARE OPEN

The Albuquerque Crowne Plaza is open for reservations. You must call to make your reservations for the reunion. The dates are April 18 through April 21. The rate is \$99,00 a night plus 13.88% tax for a total of \$112.74 and is valid up to three days before and three days after the reunion. This includes breakfast for up to two guests per day in their restaurant located in the hotel. All 22 rooms on the 11th and 12th floors are blocked out for the group. Make your reservations soon. COVID

If a relative of yours died from the Covid virus, you may be able to get reimbursed up to \$9,000 for funeral expenses. That is \$2,000 more per person than the \$7,000 upper limit announced in February. The Federal Emergency Management Administration (FEMA) is accepting applications from eligible families. The FEMA measure was part of the December COVID-19 relief law which also included a second stimulus check of up to \$600. The law includes \$2 billion for people who have been harmed by the pandemic and may have gone into debt to pay for the funeral and burial of a loved one.

2022 COLA ANNOUNCED

The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) recently announced that the annual Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) increase for 2022 will be 5.9 percent. This is the largest increase since 1981. But Medicare increases to \$170.10 each month.

The new COLA rate is effective Dec. 1, 2021, and the adjustment will appear in the Dec. 30, 2021, payment. This increase pertains to military retirees, veterans receiving disability payments from the Department of Veterans Affairs, Social Security recipients and others. By law, COLA is based on the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W), which is a broad measure of consumer prices generated by the BLS from the third quarter of the previous year to the third quarter of the current year. It measures price changes for food, housing, clothing, transportation, energy, medical care, recreation, and education. The COLA increase has averaged 1.65 percent for the past 10 years (2011-2020), and in 2009, 2010 and 2015 the increase was zero.
