2012 REUNION PLANNING TRIP

Yeo and I are back from our planning trip to San Antonio. What a fabulous city!! As most people know the Alamo is located there, but the Riverwalk is something you will have to see. Our hotel, The Holiday Inn – Riverwalk, is about three blocks from the Alamo and right on the Riverwalk. In the two and a half days Yeo and I were there we did not have time to explore more than 6 blocks from the hotel on the Riverwalk and could not have eaten in all the restaurants within that small area. The Riverwalk goes through all the downtown area and has more restaurants and shops than an Engineman can count. This is going to be a great reunion and visit to San Antonio. So make plans to be there!!!

REUNION HOTEL

The reunion will be at The Holiday Inn – Riverwalk. CAIMAN's room rate is \$85.00 a night plus 16.75% tax for a total of \$99.24. Rooms normally go for \$129.00 plus tax so we got a good deal there and no matter how hard we tried, we could not get the tax changed. All of San Antonio hotels charge for parking. The good news is it is on site and covered. The normal rate is \$16.00 a day - CAIMAN's rate - \$8.00 a day. We did talk the hotel into 1 comp night for every 20 nights CAIMAN rents (same as Reno) and four comp parking places. They, as usual, will be in the drawing. Wireless internet (WiFi) is free though out the hotel. The hotel restaurant serves a buffet breakfast that normally costs \$15.00. It will be \$10.00 for all people wearing a CAIMAN nametag. The restaurant also serves a regular breakfast at a reasonable price. The restaurant serves all meals and is open late.

RV PARKING

There are two RV parks that were recommended by the San Antonio Convention & Visitors Bureau. KOA has a park about eight miles from the hotel. Fort Sam Houston, about eight miles away, also has an RV park for retired sailors. The hotel's parking garage does NOT have room for RV's. There is a lot a short distance from the hotel for parking of empty (no living in) RV's. I will have more information in future newsletters.

AREA INFORMATION

The San Antonio Convention & Visitors Bureau will furnish us with maps and information pamphlets about the area. Copies of this information will be available in the hospitality suite. You will want one of these packets as there is a lot to do in San Antonio. Yeo and I plan to arrive the Friday or Saturday before the reunion starts so we will have the tourist information for others that like to arrive early. The CAIMAN rate will be available three days before and 3 days after the reunion dates. More in future newsletters.

HOSPITALITY SUITE

The hospitality suite is big enough for all hands and we get to bring in our own drinks and snacks. The hours will be the same as usual, 1000 to 0000 Monday and 0800 to 0000 Tuesday through Thursday. Who ever does not go on the tour on Wednesday will have the key. Coffee and doughnuts will be available every morning.

LUNCHEON

Tuesday we will have our Welcome Luncheon. It will be a buffet as usual. We didn't get as good of a deal as we did in Reno but it isn't bad. The board will be introduced as well as CAIMAN Captains and XO's that attend the reunion. That is a hint to the Captains and XO's, show up or we (I) will talk about you. The only CAIMAN business is the election of the Commander and the Secretary/Treasurer for the next four years. Ron Erb will be passing "Pull My Finger Fred" to the next lucky shipmate. Remember, if you are the lucky shipmate, you have to make the following reunion to pass "Fred" along. Since I got the last shot at CAIMAN's own "Couth Goat" Sanderlin, there is no doubt in my mind; he also will have something to say. I have a couple of "candidates" for the 2012 reunion roast. I am sure at least one of them will be there - if both show I will flip a coin.

TOUR

Thanks to Bud Hart's recommendation, on Wednesday we are going on a bus ride to Fredericksburg, Texas to visit The National Museum of the Pacific War. TRANSPORTATION

The San Antonio airport is huge. All the major airlines and several smaller airlines service the airport. There are two types of ground transportation from the airport. There is the San Antonio Shuttle which is \$18.00 per person or a cab which will cost \$25.00 - \$30.00 a trip. So, if there is more than one of you – take a cab. Car rentals are available at the airport. Car rental may not be the best choice as the hotel is located on the riverwalk and a short distance from the Alamo which will be the main areas that will be visited. Also remember all hotels in San Antonio charge for parking.

DUES

Now is a good time to pay your 2010 – 2012 dues. Dues are from reunion to reunion. As usual we will ask a registration fee from all that do not have their dues paid up.
